CANADA BASKETBALL VERIFICATION STANDARDS



Canada Basketball standards for Verified Programs are designed to outline the minimum expectations of member organizations in Canada. It is expected that all member organizations provide a developmentally appropriate, safe, enjoyable, accessible, inclusive, and welcoming playing environment for their participants, which differentiates it from non-member basketball and unorganized play. In order to be considered, member organizations must also be in good standing with their governing organization(s) and meet their expectations of membership.
